




So, how'd Israel get into this mess?


- God made a covenant with Abram:
 - The promise of land (Gen. 12:1).
 - The promise of descendants (<u>Gen. 12:2</u>).
 - The promise of blessing and redemption (Gen. 12:3).

So, how'd Israel get into this mess?

- God gave prophecies to Abraham (Gen. 15:13-21)
 - --descendants would be strangers in a land that wasn't theirs
 - -- they would be slaves in that land
 - -- they would be mistreated for 400 years
 - -- the nation that mistreated them would be punished
 - --they would experience a great deliverance and leave with many possessions
 - --in the 4th generation they would return to Canaan.







FAST FORWARD 430 YEARS

THINGS HAVE CHANGED IN EGYPT

- Jacob and the next generation died.
- The Israelites "were fruitful and multiplied greatly."
- Pharaoh "did not know Joseph."
- The institutional memory of Joseph and his role saving Egypt was lost (no back story).
- "Exceedingly numerous" Israelites fill the land and lead to fear and oppression.
- Pharaoh first enslaves the Israelites—forced labor.
- Pharaoh then plans to reduce Israelite population by killing male babies—genocide.



- God is faithful.

- God is sovereign.

- There's always a back story.
- Fear God, not people.

- God is faithful—hard times don't erase His promises
